Food Bank of the Southern Tier and C.I.D.S are collaborating with Arnot Health and Meals on Wheels of Chemung County, Inc. on the program referred to as “Kitchen Stork” and will serve up to 50 expectant mothers in Chemung County. Community Health Workers from C.I.D.S will provide support to participants throughout the duration of the program.
